Territorial Agenda 2020

Where the most developed cities and regions within Europe cooperate as parts of a polycentric pattern they add value and act as centres contributing to the development of their wider regions. (...) Polycentric territorial development policy should foster the territorial competitiveness of the EU territory [as a whole]'. We encourage cities to form networks in an innovative manner, which may allow them to improve their performance in European and global competition and promote economic prosperity towards sustainable development."

Employment

• 75% of the 20-64 year-olds to be employed

R&D / innovation

• 3% of the EU's GDP to be invested in R&D/innovation

Climate change / energy

- greenhouse gas emissions 20% lower than 1990
- 20% of energy from renewables
- 20% increase in energy efficiency

Education

- Reducing school drop-out rates below 10%
- at least 40% of 30-34—year-olds completing third level education

Poverty / social exclusion

• at least 20 million fewer people in or at risk of poverty and social exclusion




