


Urbanity, middle class families and planning in Helsinki and Stockholm

Johanna Lilius provides a fascinating account of families living in vibrant and transformed inner cities. The book moves between individual parenting experiences to media representations of parenting, urban theory and planning perspectives to suggest ways that urban living practices and uses are changing inner city structures and forms in radical and sometimes problematic ways. Using Helsinki as her touchstone, Lilius opens a thoughtful discussion on the patent domesticfication of inner cities in the Global North.



▶ TRENDS IN COPENHAGEN'S URBAN LIFE 2013

Copenhageners enjoy their access to taking a stroll on the grass, finding a seat in the sun or taking part in cultural events. Copenhageners walk more than the average Dane and often visit cafes, Nyhavn or the beach in the summer. Urban Life Account 2013 finds that nine out of ten Copenhageners are happy with the quality of urban life in Copenhagen.

Copenhagen's vision is to be a city with a diverse and unique urban life for all. A metropolis for people. We have three specific urban life goals for 2015: More urban life for all, More people to walk more and More people to stay longer.

Urban Life Account 2013 outlines key trends and present surveys and figures for urban life as well as statements from local citizens about their experiences and opinions. We take stock of the three goals and look at the development of urban life, annual variations, the impact of weather etc. This helps us review our efforts and determine what works.

Urban Life Account 2013 repeats key surveys for a comparison with 2012. In addition, Urban Life Account 2013 specifically looks at children's use of the urban space. The theme Urban Life from a Child's Perspective offers a snapshot of the urban space according to some of the youngest Copenhageners. Figures and surveys are supplemented with qualitative statements and points of view from local residents.







Urbaanit pienperheet

Taustaa kehittämisteemalle

Tyypillisesti lapsiperheet ovat muuttaneet Helsingistä kehyskuntiin. Syitä tähän kehitykseen ovat olleet muun muassa sopivan asumisvaihtoehdon puuttuminen Helsingin alueelta, asuntojen hintataso, "oman pihan kaipuu", koulut ja päivähoitopalvelut. Toisaalta lapsien määrä Helsingin kantakaupungissa on viime vuosina ollut ennakoitua suurempi, joka on asettanut haasteita mm. päivähoiton järjestämiselle. Nykyinen kerrostalojen asuntosuunnittelu ei vastaa lapsiperheiden tarpeita. Erityisesti pieni- ja keskituloisten lapsiperheiden asumismahdollisuuksien ja asuntotarjonnan houkuttelevuuden turvaaminen kytkeytyy työvoiman saatavuuden kautta koko seudun kilpailukykyyn.
